OFFICIAL MINUTES OF MAYVILLE VILLAGE COUNCIL MEETING July 19, 2016

The Village Council of Mayville, Michigan held a Regular Meeting at the Fire Hall on July 19, 2016. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Clare Fryers, Village President, with the following Officers and Trustees present: Susan Atkinson, William Barkowska, Steve Charette, Roxann Hiiter, Sue Marlow and Tony Windham.

Approval of Agenda – Moved by Hiiter, supported by Windham to approve agenda as presented. Yes 7 No 0

Tony Lopez — Was disappointed that the council rejected the revised property maintenance ordinance at the last council meeting and voiced his concerns regarding the ordinance in a whole. Doesn't see any provisions in the ordinance where if a tenant refuses access to the village an administrative warrant procedure is in place and if you don't have that in place it is unconstitutional. Fees are taxed which is a violation of the head lee amendment landlords have asked repeatedly that the village furnish the cost that they sustain in doing the inspections, the money is going somewhere. Cannot pass anything that is not revenue neutral. There have been inspections paid for, scheduled and never done, with no refunds made, under this procedure what happens if a tenant doesn't allow you access? The ordinance has been revised numerous times, but some sections of the ordinance are still not correct such as Section 3 (18-43) and Sec 4 (18-44). He feels that the council has been advised that this is illegal.

Public Comments

<u>Barb Valentine</u> - Was on the planning commission and worked on the property maintenance ordinance and she feels that if you choose to be a landlord you choose to go into a line of business which means you are expected and required to comply with the rules and regulations that go into that business. The ordinance was not meant to punish or penalize anyone if was to make much needed changes to benefit the residents of the community. If the main concern is cost then adjust the rate, but leave the ordinance.

<u>Joseph Ball</u> — Has been a property owner for five (5) years and it has not been pleasant. Would he purchase another property in Mayville? No, there is to much negativity. Feels that the village knows who needs to take care of their property. The village should put a note on door and give 30 days to comply.

<u>Clare Roller</u> – In regards to the Property Maintenance Ordinance it's not a matter of the landlords not wanting inspections it's when the ordinance gets changed over and over then goes back to the original. He would like the inspection fee to be a decent price and the ordinance to be like other communities around. Can the landlords have a price break for multi – units? Can the landlords have their own inspector, and have the village provided inspector with guidelines?

William Rappuhn – Curtis Stowe may inspect building permits, but he has nothing to do with registration or compliance of any ordinances in this village or any other village. Asked how many of the rental units have been inspected would it be 30% or 40%. The answer was No. Also, how many have failed inspections in the last 3-4 years? The answer was none. The inspections must be working.

Communications – President Fryers read a correspondence letter from a resident with suggestions for the village.

<u>Tuscola County Drain Commissioner</u> —This letter was to advise the village of the day of letting and the day of review of apportionments for the Fulton Street Drain.

<u>Tuscola County Health Department</u> – President Fryers read a letter from Jerry White from Tuscola County Health Department, regarding the restroom wastewater facilities at Ohmer Park with the recommendation that the Ohmer Park bathhouse no longer be utilized for its intended purpose until such time as either a new drain-field is installed or a connection is made to the municipal sewage system

<u>Mayville Planning Commission</u> - Moved by Charette, supported by Hiiter to accept the resignation of Annette Prothero from the Mayville Planning Commission effective immediately. Yes 7 No 0

President Fryers stated that there are three (3) opening on the Mayville Planning Commission that need to be filled.

Also Fryers reported that the Planning Commission accepted the Dollar General Site Plan on the condition that it complies with MDOT rules.
