

**OFFICIAL MINUTES OF ACT 33 OF 1951
ASSESSMENT PUBLIC HEARING
VILLAGE COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING
FEBRUARY 7, 2023
(Official)**

The Village Council of Mayville, Michigan held a Meeting at the Fire Hall on February 7th, 2023. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Steve Charette, President Pro -Tempore, with the following Officers and Trustees present: Rod Buhl, Susan Shaver and Kelly Torrey.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:

1. The Village Council of the Village of Mayville ("Village Council") Tuscola County, Michigan, has tentatively determined to create a special assessment district for the police and fire department operations and for the purchase, maintenance and operation of equipment, all in conformance with Act 33, Public Acts of Michigan, 1951 ("Act"), as amended.

2. The annual special assessment which is being considered is (3) mills (\$3.00 per \$1000) of the assessed value of all of the lands and premises located within the Village which are not otherwise exempt, which is estimated to generate the amount of \$ 48,191.75 per year.

3. The Village Council has tentatively designated the following special assessment district against which the cost of the police and fire department operations and the purchase, maintenance and operation of equipment are to be assessed:

Each of the real properties located within the boundaries of the Village

4. The Village Council will meet and conduct a public hearing in the Village of Mayville Fire Hall, 6044 Trend St, Mayville, MI 48744 on February 22, 2023, at 7 o'clock p.m. Michigan Time, to hear and consider any objections to the above-described special assessment district.

5. PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that the question of raising money for police and fire protection by special assessment must be submitted to the electors of the Village if the owners of 10 percent of the land in the special assessment district petition for a referendum.

6. If the Village Council approves the making of the special assessment, such assessment may be levied against properties that benefit thereby. Act 186 of the Public Act of Michigan, 1973, as amended, provides that the special assessment must be protested at the hearing held for the purpose of confirming the special assessment roll before the Michigan Tax Tribunal may acquire jurisdiction of any dispute involving the special assessment. The hearing for the purpose of confirming the special assessment roll will be held, if at all, at some time in the future pursuant to notice given as required by law. Appearance and protest at such hearing is required in order to appeal the amount of the special assessment to the Michigan Tax Tribunal. An owner of or party in interest in property to be assessed, or his or her agent, may appear in person to protest the special assessment, or may protest the special assessment by letter filed with the Village Clerk at or prior to the time of the hearing, in which case appearance in person is not required.
